Trinity B.Ed College observed Partition Remembrance Day on 14 August 2026 to commemorate the sufferings, sacrifices and hardships experienced by millions of people during the Partition of Bengal. The programme aimed to sensitise the student-teachers about the historical significance of Partition, particularly its profound social and humanitarian consequences, and to encourage the values of peace, harmony, unity and mutual respect.

The programme commenced with the Lamp Lighting Ceremony by the Principal Ma'am, symbolising the beginning of the commemorative programme. It was followed by a speech by the Principal Ma'am, who addressed the gathering on the significance of observing Partition Remembrance Day and reflected upon the lessons that present and future generations can learn from this difficult chapter of history.

Following the Principal's address, Talim delivered a speech highlighting the historical background and human experiences associated with Partition.

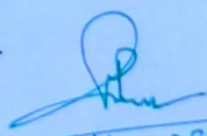
The students of the 4th Semester then presented a group song, adding an emotional and reflective dimension to the programme. This was followed by a poem recitation by Kajal and Anchal, through which the pain, displacement and human suffering associated with Partition were expressed creatively.

A skit was subsequently presented by the 4th Semester students. Through dramatic representation, the students portrayed the experiences and hardships faced by ordinary people during the period of Partition. The performance helped the audience understand the human dimension of the historical event and encouraged reflection on the importance of peace and social harmony.

The programme continued with a speech by Sadaf, followed by a PowerPoint presentation by Debojyoti and Neha. The presentation provided the audience with a visual understanding of the historical circumstances and consequences of Partition and complemented the speeches and cultural presentations conducted earlier.

The observance of Partition Remembrance Day thus became a meaningful educational and commemorative experience for the student-teachers. The programme not only recalled the sufferings associated with Partition but also conveyed a strong message regarding the importance of preserving unity, humanity, tolerance and peaceful coexistence in society. The active participation of the students, teachers and college authorities contributed to the successful observance of the programme.
